



At Home Daily Fit for In-Class Attendance Screening Questionnaire

We require you to review the following questionnaire prior to leaving each morning for school. This is to assist in determining if you are fit to attend St. Bernadette School during the COVID-19 pandemic. Please post this in a high traffic area in your home so you can remember to review it each morning.

St. Bernadette School reserves the right to refuse admittance to any person on the basis of symptoms that are related to COVID-19.

Risk Assessment:

1.	Is your child showing key symptoms of COVID? Symptoms include fever*, chills, new or worsening cough, shortness of breath, loss of sense of smell or taste, nausea, vomiting or diarrhea	Yes	No
2.	Is your child feeling generally unwell this morning?	Yes	No
3.	Has your child returned to Canada from outside the country (including USA) in the past 14 days?	Yes	No
4.	Are you a confirmed contact of a person confirmed to have COVID-19?	Yes	No
If you answer "YES" to any of the above, your child is not permitted to enter into the school, and you must self-isolate.			

**Allergy Assessment:

4.	Does your child suffer from allergies that could be misinterpreted as COVID-19 symptoms?	Yes	No
If you answered "YES", the school needs an assessment from your family doctor for our files plus any appropriate allergy medication must be sent with the child to school or kept at the school.			

If you answered YES to questions 1, 2 or 3 and/or your child has a fever, please seek a health assessment by contacting 8-1-1 or a primary care provider. If a health assessment is required, you should not return to school until COVID-19 has been excluded and your symptoms have improved.

If you answer "NO" to all of the above, you can attend school.

* **Fever** checks should be done every morning. Children can't always tell when they have a fever. A baseline should be taken and recorded prior to the start of school. Take your child's temperature for a few consecutive days at the same time of the day using the same method and record the results. Anything above the baseline should be considered a possible fever.

****Allergies** sometimes present the same symptoms as COVID-19. Saying your child has allergies is not an acceptable response for allowing your child to stay in the school when they are symptomatic. An assessment from your family doctor is needed so school staff can make an informed decision if your child becomes symptomatic. Suffering from allergies does not exempt a child from being sent home if they are symptomatic.
